

## **IYNC Travel Grant Program General Criteria IYNC2020 Sydney, Australia**

These grants are designed to help students and young professionals travel to IYNC2020 in Sydney, Australia.

These grants are designed to increase the global diversity of the meeting. Given the theme this year, 'Diversity in Nuclear', ensuring the conference is accessible to a diverse range of delegates is of particular importance.

Prospective applicants must fill out the required form, which details why a grant is being requested. The response will be evaluated against criteria listed below, and grants will be awarded to the highest-scoring applicants.

In order to maximise global diversity, a limit will be placed on the number of grants awarded to each country.

**Approximately 18 grants**, each of **\$1000** (US Dollar) will be awarded.

Recipients will be reimbursed within 2 months after the conference via wire transfer or Transferwise based on receipts (please keep all receipts).

The deadline for applications is **1 October 2019**.

Grant allocations will be decided two weeks after the closing deadline and all applicants will be notified by email.

Applications will be made online via the IYNC2020 website. The applicant will be required to provide personal contact information, demonstrate their involvement with IYNC/YGNs and describe their motivation for attending IYNC2020.

Please confirm acceptance of the awarded grant within one week from receiving the confirmation email.

Recipients will be required to provide evidence of conference registration, flights and accommodation bookings in advance of the conference to confirm attendance. This is to ensure any grants allocated to recipients unable to attend are reallocated.
