Theme: "Women Going Critical in Nuclear"

Women are steadily increasing their leadership positions in the industry and taking a critical role in the future of nuclear energy. This workshop will focus on providing young women in nuclear with expert pieces of advice (or "golden rule") from experienced women leaders.

Speakers: Successful, female leaders in the nuclear industry

Participants: Maximum of 50 people

Concept: The participants will be grouped in teams of 8 to 9, and will rotate to each of the speakers' locations. To encourage discussion and networking, each speaker will challenge its group to evaluate her golden rule and its personal applicability. These questions will be used to initiate the discussion of the specific golden rule. The main two goals of each speaker location will be to effectively communicate and discuss the specific golden rule, and to network with both the speaker and the other participants.

Output: Group discussion of major themes, significant realizations and a short conclusion from the workshop's manager.
